THE BUSH PRESIDENCY: TWO WARS, TWO REACTIONS August 17-21, 2006

Americans define the Presidency of George W. Bush by two things - the fight against terrorism and the war in Iraq. And while the first is something positive many see in the President, the second worries more Americans.

When asked to put in their own words what they like best about the Bush Presidency, the war on terrorism garners the most responses. One in ten Americans - 11% -- cites the President's handling of the war on terrorism. Second, with 5%, is that the President is (as he himself has said) the "decider," he is decisive and makes generally good decisions. His handling of the war in Iraq comes third, with 4%.

What is most striking, however, is that more than half the country is unable to volunteer something they like best about the President or say they like nothing.

Far fewer people had any difficulty deciding what about the Bush Presidency they liked the least, and their overwhelming answer was the handling of the war in Iraq and its effects. Behind that came the handling of immigration, the handling of the economy, and the President's policies in general.

These voluntary answers reflect both the President's low approval rating (36% in this poll) and what are clearly his strengths and weaknesses. 55% of Americans now approve of the way the President is handling the campaign against terrorism, but only 30% approve of how he is handling Iraq.

Even for the President's partisans, the war in Iraq emerges as the number one dislike. It was mentioned by 23% of Republicans. 10% named immigration policy. 10% of conservatives cited immigration.

The war on terrorism has been near the top of people's minds since just after the September 11, 2001 attacks. Nearly half of the public said the handling of it was what they liked best about the Bush Presidency at the beginning of 2002. Then, more than a year before the war in Iraq began, many more Americans were unsure about what they didn't like than about what they liked.
